The Commies' Hail Mary last week was nothing like the first one on December 28, 1975. The Pokes were trailing the Hornheads 14-10 in the final seconds of a divisional-round playoff. Pokes QB Roger (the Dodger) Staubach told Drew Pearson (the original "88") "...make a move and go deep" as they lined up at the 50.

Pearson obeyed, shoving his CB to the ground, snatching the pass and scoring to stun the Hornheads. Staubach joked afterward that he was simply "A Catholic kid from Cincinnati," who had closed his eyes and said a Hail Mary prayer for a win.

Part of the excitement is the rarity; Hail Marys an 8% success rate, working once in every twelve attempts since 2014. There have been nearly 200 attempts since the start of the 2009 season, producing sixteen TDs. Discount Double Check has four since then, and Andy (The Beige Water Pistol) Dalton is the only other QB with more than one during that span, both to WR AJ Green.

The irony of Rodgers' Hail Mary success is that coaches typically pulled Favre from that portion of practice to protect his arm. "You get good at it by practicing them," Rodgers said over the summer. "I was always doing the Hail Mary reps in those years, and I got used to throwing it outside the pocket or finding a spot to throw it inside the pocket, and kind of got used to what the throw felt like, height and distance wise."
