From the Sublime to the Ridiculous

The NFL announced Sunday night that the Bengal-Stillers tilt would be moved to Saturday night primetime. While the Bengals have qualified for multiple primetime games with their talented offense

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and plucky uniforms, the Orange and Black is 10-43 in primetime, including 2-2 this season. The downside: it's the first team ever to have five primetime games in a single season since...ever.

Hard to deny the playoff implications, and the NFL will be allowed to showcase the Stillers, who will be either the six or seven seed in the AFC. Unfortunately, the Bengals are 3-7 away from Mayberry at night under HC Zac (Opie) Taylor, while the Stillers are 10-3 since 2019.

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THE LOOKAHEAD

Saturday

Cleveland Tankers vs. Baltimore Dumpster Ducks (-17.5/42.5)

The Browns have named QB Bailey (Roger Troutman and) Zappe as the fortieth starting QB since Version 2.0 in 1999.
