Cheeseheads QB Jordan Love (Broker) has an elbow and WR (Sister) Chirstian Watson is injured as usual. That simply means that the Pack turns to RB Josh Jacobs to carry the load. Unfortunately, this Philly Gang Green defense is tough and physical, so this game is gonna be a slobberknocker.

The Minnesota-Detroit was the first ever for teams with double digit wins with the One Seed and division crown on the line. All of these teams can win it all, and you have a handful in the next tier with a puncher's chance. It is incredible.

For those who have trumpeted Tampa Bay and Mayfield, he hasn't won anything yet. Too often his games end with a whimper, not a bang, as he throws the game-losing INT. The Look Man was wrong about them losing the division last week, but there is no doubt about their mediocrity.

Brady consistently posted six wins against his substandard AFC East division opponents, winning double digit games every season. Cake lost twice to Atlanta in 2024. The Look Man doesn't question that Cake is a good QB who has grown up some since leaving Cleveland. He questions whether Cake will ever win a championship. To paraphrase Herm Edwards, "you play to win the Chip" and there are 31 teams that will go home unhappy.

One other note: 2024 has been a nice ride, but too many teams allow wins to become losses because they lack a dependable running game. If you can't milk the clock in the fourth quarter, you allow the opponent to pull victory from the jaws of defeat. RIP, Marty, who was always more worried about losing than happy about winning and this stat proves it out. Honorable mention for Shula, Marvin Lewis and Tomlin, all with seven early outs.
