THE LOOKAHEAD

Mahomes and the Baby Backs go for the unprecedented Three-Peat against an Iggles squad that can beat you with the run, the pass, or the zebras. KC is attempting this feat against the Number One rated

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defense in the NFL. The Iggles have given up the fewest rushing and passing yards of any defense, led by D-Co Vic Fangio. The secondary includes Darius (Big Play) Slay, LB Zack Baun, and safety (Britt) Reed Blankenship. These green hornets can play, and if the zebras allow DT Jalen Carter to go full Mean Joe Green and head slap O-linemen, it could get ugly.

The Iggles didn't sign Saquon to get to the Big Game; they signed him to eat clock, keep Mahomes on the pine, and win the Lombardi Trophy. If he fails to do so, they spent a lot of time and money on very little.

It is an old shoe that defense wins championships, and if that holds true, the Iggles will be victorious. EPILOGUE

This game is being heralded as a referendum on the GOAT at QB, but the Look Man disagrees. The real comparison is whether teams win games versus individual players.

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Other than that anomalous win, Brady's teams won six, and lost three, twice to Eli (Elite) Manning and the New York Football Jynts, and once to the (Big Dick) Nick Foles and the Iggles.
